








Are you ready to switch?

Many common fluorescent light fittings become obsolete on 1st February 2024. Here's what you need to know.

The UK Government has published its timetable for banning the sale of lamps containing mercury in England, Scotland and Wales. The change forms part of the restriction of hazardous substances (RoHS) Directive* and follows similar bans across the EU.

The lamp type exemptions mirror those of the EU, but with extended implementation timescales as listed below.

- The lamp types above cannot be placed on the market after the stated dates.
- This list only covers the most significant general lighting lamps. Please check the [DEFRA website](#) for a comprehensive list.
- The lamps above may still be available from your suppliers after these dates until stock is exhausted.
- You should start planning for the future now:
 - Find out if LED retrofit lamps are available or if new light fittings are needed
 - Consult your supplier to check your options.
